
Department of Home Affairs


The Department of Home Affairs provides key public services, including administration, law enforcement, immigration management, and emergency response. To implement these functions effectively, the department works through four sub-departments: Public Administration, Karenni State Police, Immigration, and Emergency and Rescue. These sub-departments coordinate to deliver public services directly to communities across the state.

(A) The Public Administration Sub-department

As of the third quarter of 2025, the Public Administration Sub-department has initiated the operation of the interim administrative system which has now been established in 16 townships and 1 city with participation from local communities and relevant stakeholders. Key activities carried out during this period include drafting the policy for Interim Local Governance, providing oversight and guidance to the office administration of Township Administration Committees/Councils, and coordinating with civil society organizations (CSOs) to implement local development initiatives, facilitating training schools on Public Administration, and collaborating with relevant departments to support law enforcement and rule of law functions.

(B) The Sub-department of the Karenni State Police

During the third quarter of 2025, the Karenni State Police Sub-department continued to implement law enforcement and public security responsibilities across Karenni State through its Headquarters, Township Police Stations, and Police Posts. The Police Headquarters consists of the Public Affairs, Information and Communications, Police Operations, Capacity Building, and Finance units. At the Police posts, services are carried out through office administration, area patrol, investigation unit, security team, and traffic control teams, who are taking their role in the protection of communities and maintenance of public safety across the state.

During the reporting period, to carry out law enforcement, security, and public service functions across the state, in collaboration with partner organizations and civil society groups, the Karenni State Police Sub-department continued to operate in line with the Karenni State Police Law and Police Operational Guidelines as enacted by the KSCC and IEC.

The Crime and Records Sub-department systematically maintained and updated case records, including newly opened cases, suspect and accused lists, registered the cases under police investigation, cases ongoing court trial, cases with final verdicts, and records of individuals sentenced to imprisonment or held in police custody.



During the third quarter of 2025, the Traffic Control Sub-division continued to carry out traffic management and road safety activities across township areas.

To improve road safety and the protection of local communities, awareness sessions were organized for the public on traffic rules and road safety, distribution of informational pamphlets, and the installation of warning and guidance signboards. In crowded and high-traffic areas, traffic teams and township patrol units were also deployed to conduct on-the-ground road safety checks, promote traffic regulations, traffic flow in coordination with local traffic volunteers to ensure smooth movement of the vehicle, and respond to traffic-related accident cases in a timely manner.

(c) The Immigration Sub-department

The Immigration Sub-department carried out the collection of household population registration forms (Form Aa Hta Sa-1) and conducted entry and exit screening at border and checkpoint gates, issued Interstate Travel Passes (IP) for travelling, issued the verification temporary residence documents for workers, and Border Crossing Passes (BP) for cross-border travel.



(D) The Emergency and Rescue Sub-department



The Emergency and Rescue Sub-department is supporting civilians from conflict-affected areas by evacuate them to safer locations, and providing emergency medical referral assistance for injured resistance fighters and civilians. From July to September 2025, the sub-department assisted the relocation of approximately 400 internally displaced persons (IDPs) to safe areas. Additionally, during a situation of heavy airstrikes in Mawchi area in August and September, the sub-department facilitated the transportation of injured civilians to nearby hospitals and clinics for medical treatment. Furthermore, the Emergency and Rescue Sub-department also conducted community safety awareness on landmine risk education, fire hazard awareness, preparation steps, and basic first aid and civilian protection instructions.

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
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The Interim Executive Council of Karenni State Department of Education



Department of Education

The Department of Education continued to deliver education services through its three sub-departments: Basic Education, Higher Education, and the Livelihood Sub-department. The Basic Education Sub-department provided financial support to teachers, conducted field assessments of school conditions, and facilitated the appointment and coordination of township education officers.

To expand learning opportunities beyond the basic level, the Higher Education Sub-department worked with schools and institutions offering advanced studies and collaborated with specialists and stakeholders to develop higher education policy frameworks for Karenni State.

Although technical and vocational training opportunities remain limited in Karenni State, the Livelihood Sub-department continued efforts to collaborate with existing alternative education schools and promote the development of livelihood and skills training programs aimed at supporting self-reliance and local economic development.

(A) The Basic Education Sub-department


The Basic Education Sub-department provides support for community-based schools through collaboration with Seh Theh Foundation (STF) and Clean Yangon. The Sub-department conducted field assessments and distributed essential teaching and learning materials to basic schools, in addition to developing school registration guidelines and providing Community School Governance (CSG) training to township education officers.

Furthermore, in partnership with the NUG Ministry of Education, the Sub-department provided financial support to G-BECA examination centers and assisted with the coordination and administration of examinations. Additionally, in collaboration with Seh Theh Foundation (STF), the Basic Education Sub-department provides monthly financial support for teachers.

(B) The Higher Education Sub-department

As part of its efforts to strengthen access to the quality of higher education in Karenni State, the Higher Education Sub-department prepared the budget estimate, reviewed actual expenditure, managed to allocate the required funding for the universities and degree providing colleges, developed academic guidelines for universities and degree-providing colleges, and drafted Terms of Reference (TOR) for the assessment and recognition of non-formal education programs. Implementation of the project also progressed on drafting standards and quality criteria for higher education institutions. To support the implementation of higher education programs, the sub-department coordinated and collaborated with Phan Sor University, Technological University, Karenni University of Nursing, Karenni Medical College, and Karenni Education Degree College.

(C) The Livelihood Sub-department

As part of the Livelihood Sub-department's activities, it prepared the three-month budget estimate for vocational education and allocated funding to four vocational training schools. It also conducted field visits to vocational and livelihood training centers across Karenni State to coordinate activities and to develop strategic plans related to vocational and livelihood education opportunities.

Department of Health

The Department of Health is providing health services across Karenni State through its four Sub-departments: Medical Treatment Services, Public Health, Health Information and Statistics, and Administration and Finance. Health services are currently delivered through three hospitals and a network of community clinics which offering outpatient care, inpatient care, and surgical treatment services to civilians and security personnel.

The Department also worked collaboratively with local health organizations to strengthen community-based public health programs and ensure essential health care support for the public.

(A) The Medical Treatment Service Sub-department


The Medical Treatment Services Sub-department is working to establish coordination mechanisms to strengthen collaboration with hospitals providing health services in Karenni State. The health services provided in Karenni State within the 3rd quarter are documented and presented in the table below.

(B) The Public Health Sub-department

The Public Health Sub-department continued to collaborate with health service partners to strengthen the capacity of township health teams in providing services in the areas of disease prevention and control, immunization services, maternal and child health care, and primary health care.



Primary Health Care Service




(C) Health Information and Statistics Sub-department

During three months, the Health Information and Statistics Sub-department coordinated with township health focal teams to prepare monthly reporting formats, developed data sets for the Rehabilitation and Artificial Limb Production Center, and coordinated the preparation of monthly reports. In addition, pharmacy and logistics-related forms/formats were also set up, and data cleansing, verification, and data entry for the monthly reports submitted by the various health service organizations operating across Karenni State..

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Department of Humanitarian and Rehabilitation

During the third quarter of 2025, the Department of Humanitarian and Rehabilitation carried out several activities, including providing humanitarian assistance, supporting the relocation and settlement of internally displaced people, managing internal administrative operations, strengthening staff capacity, holding regular departmental coordination meetings, collaborating with focal persons from other sectors, conducting fundraising efforts, and developing strategic plans for the department.

Of the four sub-departments planned to be formed under the Department of Humanitarian and Rehabilitation, three have now been established and are operational: the Emergency Response Sub-department, the Humanitarian Support Sub-department, and the Administration and Management Sub-department.

(A) The Emergency Responses Sub-department

During the third quarter, the Emergency Response Sub-department offered assistance to internally displaced households who were forced to flee due to military airstrikes in the eastern areas of Phe Khon and Nan Mae Khon Townships. A total of 653 households (2,557 individuals: 1,259 male and 1,298 female) received dry food and emergency shelter materials, in coordination with the respective Township Administration Councils.

Some displaced families had already been forced to flee more than three times and were facing serious difficulties in securing stable shelter. To support these families, 200 temporary tents were provided across four townships. The distribution was carried out under the supervision of the Township Administration Councils, with technical and human resource support from the Emergency Response Sub-department.

In addition, assistance was provided to 1,000 civilians who were trapped on the eastern side of Phe Khon Township by relocating them to safer areas and supplying them with basic food provisions.

(B) Providing short-term support to the Internally Displaced Persons

Using the humanitarian funds received, the Humanitarian Support Sub-department distributed food supplies to 60 displacement camps across 8 townships in Karenni State, supporting a total of 3,080 households, which consisted of 5,901 males and 6,085 females (11,985 people in total).

Additionally, emergency shelter materials were provided to 58 households in 4 camps located in Loi Nan Pha, Nan Mae Khon, Dee Baung Khu, and Pekon Townships.

(C) Support to the Victims of War Crimes committed by the illegal Military Regime

In the 3rd quarter, the department provided financial assistance as humanitarian support to the families of 11 civilians who were killed and 13 civilians who were injured due to airstrikes in Karenni State.

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Interim Executive Council of Karenni State Department of Planning, Finance and Taxation



Department of Planning, Finance, and Taxation

The Department of Planning, Finance, and Taxation is responsible for developing project plans that reflect the federal principles, preparing and coordinating revenue estimates, allocating budget funds equally and fairly, collecting and managing taxes systematically, and ensuring fund transparency in allocation budgets. These functions are carried out systematically through its four sub-departments: Planning Sub-department, Finance Sub-department, Taxation Sub-department, and Administration and Accounting Sub-department.

(A) Planning Sub-department

In the third quarter of 2025, the Planning Sub-Department has been implementing (6) regional development projects in coordination with other relevant departments. Among these, (3) road repair projects have been completed, along with (2) bridge construction projects and (1) office building construction project. 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

Trade, Investment and Transport Department

The Department of Trade, Investment, and Transport operates through four sub-departments: the Trade Sub-department, Investment Sub-department, Transport and Communications Sub-department, and Finance Sub-department. The Department is responsible for registering exporters and importers, issuing import/export permits, registering companies and business enterprises, issuing vehicle licenses, driver's licenses, and developing trade policies appropriate for the context of Karenni State.

Department of Women and Child

The Department of Women and Child carries out its operations through four sub-departments: the Women's Affairs Sub-department, the Child Affairs Sub-department, the Research Sub-department, and the Administration and Finance Sub-department.

During the third quarter of 2025, the Women's Affairs Sub-department carried out activities such as providing support to vulnerable groups, offering financial assistance to mothers, organizing trainings, participating in international meetings and workshops, distributing hygiene kits, managing gender-based violence cases, and drafting laws and policies.

The Child Affairs Sub-department provided support to vulnerable groups, developed the nursery child development activities, conducted awareness and training sessions on child rights, distributed newborn kits to newborn babies, and participated in the Women and Child Affairs Working Committee.

The Research Sub-department documented various records, includes: the list of preschools, preschool students and teachers, pregnant and breastfeeding mothers, the population records of internally displaced persons who relocated due to emergencies, and the records of individuals injured by airstrikes.

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Interim Executive Council of Karenni State Department of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation



Department of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation

The Department of Agriculture, Livestock, and Irrigation operates through three sub-departments: the Agricultural Technology Sub-department, the Livestock and Veterinary Sub-department, and the Irrigation Sub-department.

During the third quarter of 2025, the Department of Agriculture, Livestock, and Irrigation carried out the following activities:

(A) The Agricultural Technology Sub-department

The Agricultural Technology Sub-Department conducted agricultural technical training for farmers, established model demonstration plots for seasonal crops, implemented comparative soil fertility test plots, carried out seed production nurseries for paddy seed multiplication, and produced natural fertilizers. In addition, it produced rice husk biochar, EM solution, and natural plant nutrient extracts are also conducted.

As a result of these activities, farmers have shown increased interest in new farming techniques, and they have become more capable of independently producing and using natural agricultural inputs than before.

(B) The Livestock and Veterinary Sub-department

The Livestock and Veterinary Services Sub-department conducted livestock development training courses, provided vaccinations for cattle and buffalo, vaccinations for pigs, and carried out rabies vaccinations for dogs. It also established model Local Breed Chicken farms, delivered training for community animal health workers, disease prevention and response activities, and provided surgical treatment services.

As a result of these activities, the community has shown increased interest in livestock production and has gained more confidence in administering vaccinations for disease prevention.

(C) The Irrigation Sub-department

During the 3rd quarter, the Irrigation Sub-Department has been repairing a road bridge located in Loi Nang Pha Township. The Sub-department has received requests from the locals to repairs streams, dams, and bridges necessary for agricultural productivity, and in response, the department is making efforts to carry out these projects to meet the farming needs.

The Department of Defense was formed on 29 July 2025 to protect and safeguard the lives and properties of civilians within the state while working to minimize the impacts of ongoing armed conflicts, counterattacks, and prevent potential threats to the people of Karenni State.

The Department of Defense consists of the Weapons Maintenance and Supervision Sub-department, Military Public Relations Sub-department, Intelligence Sub-department, Military Ethics and Monitoring Sub-department, and Office Management and Finance Sub-department.

Since it was founded, the Department of Defense has been collaborating with the Karenni Joint Chiefs of Staff on security-related operations, coordinating efforts for military integration in Karenni State, meeting with various armed forces within the state, and providing support to fallen comrades' families.

Goals of the Department of Defense

The goal of the Department of Defense is to protect and safeguard the lives and livelihoods of the Karenni people, and to advance toward a peaceful federal state.

Aims of the Department of Defense are

- 1) Engage in operations for the necessary defense and protection of the civilians
- 2) To safeguard the lives, property of the civilians
- 3) Ensure the fair and respectful treatment of both civilians and defense personnel
- 4) Gather, analyze, and share the information to provide early warning to prevent threats

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
