Department of Home Affairs, The Sub-Department of Public Administration

The Sub-department of Public Administration under the Department of Home Affairs is currently carrying out its functions across 16 townships, 1 town and 92 village tracts where township-level administrative structures have been established. Administrative operations and procedural training have been conducted in each township. Additionally, a federal-based public administration policy for Karenni State is in the process of being drafted. In the first six months of the year, township and village-level municipal committees were formed in three townships and municipal public services have been initiated in collaboration with community-based groups.

The Sub-department of Karenni State Police

The Karenni State Police Sub-department is currently overseeing the rule of law, carrying out law enforcement and security operations for the safety of the public in line with the Karenni State Police Law and police guidelines. Additionally, it is conducting refresher training for police officers and is in the process of developing a curriculum to support the future establishment of a police academy.

The Health Department is delivering medical services to the Karenni community and members of resistance forces through three hospitals and clinics operating on the ground. These services include outpatient care, inpatient treatment, and surgical treatments. The department works closely with health organizations and associations across Karenni State to implement public health initiatives.

Department of Education

The Basic Education Sub-Department under the Department of Education has undertaken a range of activities, including supporting teachers, distributing school textbooks and teaching materials, and constructing basic educational infrastructure in collaboration with community-based organizations. It has also taken the role in appointing township education officers and provided support for the operation of township education offices. Furthermore, it has initiated the formation of School Management Committees and Township Education Councils, worked in coordination with the NUG Ministry of Education and Township Education Boards to implement the new Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECA) system, collaborated with the relevant organizations in offering the training for teachers courses by township, provided support to children affected or killed by the conflict, assisted in supplying roofing materials in cooperation with relevant departments to enable to opening of the schools, and also worked on compiling lists of teachers and students.

The Higher Education Sub-Department has undertaken several key activities, including coordinating efforts to establish a Comprehensive University in Karenni State and drafting charters for individual institutions. It has initiated the formation of a Higher Education Council, collaborated with donor organizations to support the continued operation of universities and colleges, and partnered with educational organizations to offer training courses that help students access international scholarship opportunities. Additionally, it has coordinated support for distance university students to continue their education and has compiled and maintained data related to higher education institutions and colleges.

Sub-department of Emergency and Rescue

The Emergency Rescue Sub-department has been supporting civilians in conflict-affected areas by facilitating their relocation to safer zones. It has also provided emergency assistance and successfully transferred injured revolutionary comrades and civilians to hospitals. Two batches of emergency rescue training were conducted, resulting in the graduation of 200 rescue personnel.

The Fire Services Unit responded to three fire outbreaks and successfully extinguished them. As part of its fire prevention efforts, the unit is conducting field inspections at public fuel stations, markets, and factories to ensure fire extinguishers are properly in place. Additionally, the department has carried out approximately 150 missions of water distribution to people in the internally displaced camps, delivering an estimated total of 240,000 gallons of water.

The Immigration Sub-department takes responsibility for conducting household surveys, monitoring entries and departures of people, issuing residence permits, issuing border crossing permits, conducting population censuses in the ground, and collecting socio-economic data in the 16 townships and 1 town, which was established under the Public Administration Sub-department.



The Department of Women and Child

During the first six months of 2025, the Department of Women and Child provided support to the vulnerable groups, including women and children, organized capacity-building training sessions for women leaders across various sectors, facilitated the GBV coordination meetings to address related issues in collaboration with relevant groups, and collaborated on developing a Gender Policy Framework. Moreover, the department actively participated in international conferences and exchanges on women’s issues, managed gender-based violence cases, and distributed individual hygiene kits, raincoats, blankets, clothing, and cash assistance. Support was also extended to children who were injured or lost their lives due to airstrikes. Furthermore, the department conducted awareness training on child rights, research on women and child affairs, and initiated drafting the bill to prevent violence against women.

Department of Justice

The Legal Supervision Sub-department of the Department of Justice is responsible for reviewing draft legislation, overseeing legal officers in case handling/management while the Ethics Reform and Rehabilitation Sub-department is responsible for the custody and taking care of prisoners.



Department of Agriculture, Livestock and Irrigation

In the first six months of the 2025 fiscal year, the Department of Agriculture, Livestock, and Irrigation carried out its operations through three sub-departments: the Agricultural Technology Sub-department, the Livestock and Veterinary Sub-department, and the Irrigation Sub-department.

The **Agricultural Technology Sub-department** led activities such as organizing farmers' assemblies, producing and cultivating quality seeds, implementing model plots, enhancing staff capacity, producing organic fertilizers, and distributing various seeds and seedlings.

The **Livestock and Veterinary Sub-department** provided veterinary treatment, managing the vaccinations, sharing livestock farming knowledge and techniques, and facilitating in raising of livestock workers.

The **Irrigation Sub-department** carried out maintenance and repair of canals and streams, bridges and roads, and repaired the important roads for trade transportation.

Department of Humanitarian and Rehabilitation

During the first six months of 2025, the Department of Humanitarian and Rehabilitation undertook various activities to support civilians affected by armed conflict. These included emergency rescue and relief operations, providing humanitarian aid, awareness-raising on Early Warning and Early Response (EWER) for airstrike, distribution of drinking water, support for returning displaced persons to their origin, participation in the humanitarian policy development process, and systematic documentation and data collection on casualties and injuries caused by heavy weapons and airstrikes.


Department of Planning, Finance and Taxation
